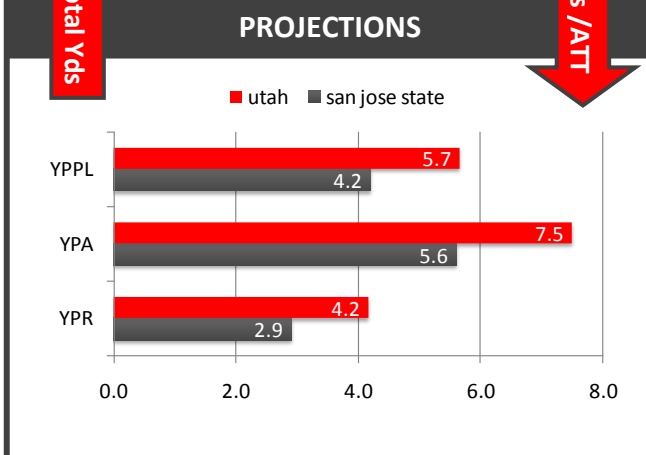
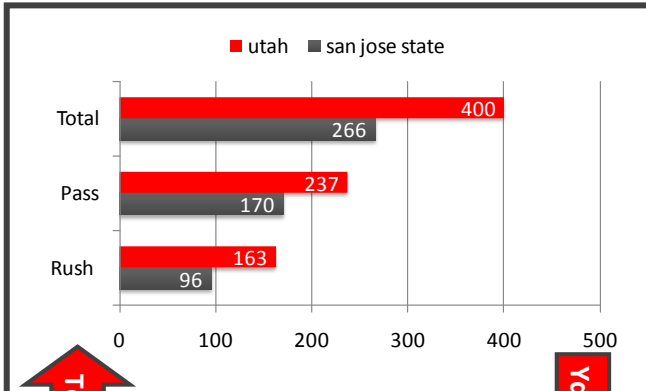

**KEY 'S TO THE GAME**

- ÷ Can SJSU stop Utah's rush attack? SJSU allowed 7.6 ypr (342yds) LW to USC and gets a Utah off fresh off a 50 rush att game v Utah State (4.7 ypr)
- ÷ Can SJSU muster any sort of offense this year? They averaged 282 ypg LY and get a Utah defense that allowed only 289 ypg LY
- ÷ Utah h allowed 342 yd LW v Ut St, but 96 of that came on one play, and Utah had 3 TO's in that game, so can Utah hold on to the ball and limit the big plays on Def?

**SUMMARY**

SJSU gained only 121 yds LW, and while USC's Def is clearly better than Utah's, it isn't by that big a margin. Take away the one home run play for Ut St LW and Utah allowed 238 yds, which is about what I'd suspect from SJSU in this game. If you use just last years results our projections would call for 577 yds offense for Utah, based on our conservative early season blend we project 400 yds for Utah, but is suspect that is way under what they'll actually get. Still all our models and math project 38-40 points. Based on SJSU projected offense of barely 250 yards the could conceivably get shut out or most likely held to under 10 w/o some fortunate TOs or Special Teams. I'll still with the average of our models, which is 13. IT still being early and a few unknowns I'll control my enthusiasm, but just some.. **Utah 40 SJSU 13. Utah is a #3 Recommended play at -13.5.**
