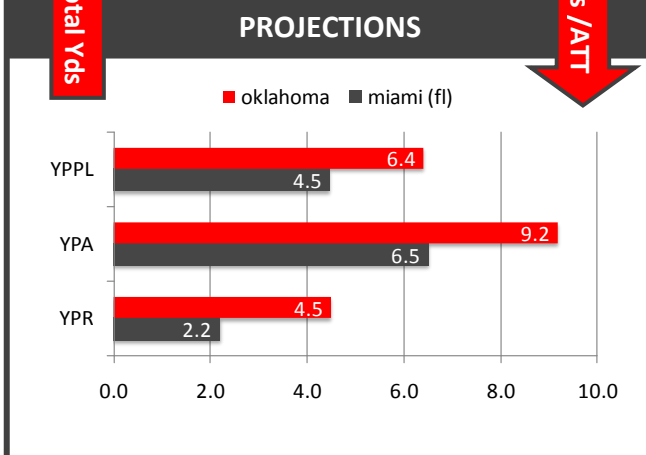
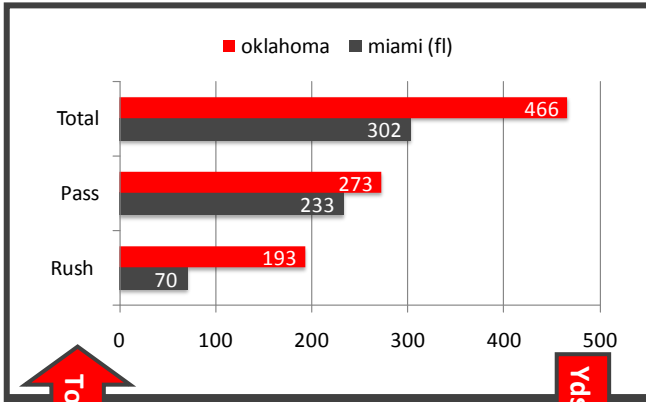
Oklahoma is a #3 recommended play (1 Units)

KEY 'S TO THE GAME

- ÷ Can Miami establish any sort of a running game? OU is allowing 78 ypg rush (22 to BYU) and Miami has rushed for over 100 yds only once (GT)
- ÷ How does Miami look on O vs a real pass D? OU held better passing teams (BYU & Tulsa) to 5.4 ypa (1.9 ypa less than those Os are averaging).
- ÷ How does OU's new QB look in his 1st real road test as a starter (I am assuming Bradford doesn't play). LW in 1st real test (I ignore the Idaho St tune up) as starter (Tulsa) he looked sick - 336 passing and 529 ypg (9.1 yppl)

SUMMARY

OU's DFheld BYU to 265 yds (4.7 yppl), which is the same BYU O that lit up FSU for 473 yds (8.9 yppl including 10.8 ypa)...what got lost in the FSU-BYU game was 5 BYU TOs. Miami has faced 1 elite D (LW @ VT) and was stuffed for just 209 yds (3.0 yppl). The hype surrounding this Miami/FSU/BYU/OU circle is a bit overkill and frankly has you arriving at the wrong conclusion. FSUs D isn't good (allowing 407 ypg TY), and was torched by a BYU O that OU's D shut down (see above). OUs offense struggled in a game where they lost Bradford but has been lights out since (Tulsa's D is allowing only 326 ypg TY & 7.3 yppl). Miami is 7-11 ATS at home vs top 25 and OU is 9-0 off a bye week when facing non-conf foe. Model average is 43 -23 OU with 466-546 yd ranges for OU and only 302-326 for Miami (which makes 23 for Miami very aggressive). **Oklahoma 42 Miami 20, OU is a #3 recommended play at -7.5**
